

Title: Community Gun Safety Initiatives to Improve Community Knowledge and Awareness

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- 1 WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in 2020, the most recent year for which
- 2 complete data is available, 45,222 people died from gun-related injuries in the United States. Suicide accounted for
- 3 54% of U.S. gun deaths in 2020, 43% from homicide. In the U.S., 58% of all gun deaths among children and teens
- 4 are homicides. Youth violence has lasting harmful effects on young people, families, and communities, and
- WHEREAS, more than 1,200 people in Michigan died from gun violence in 2019, an average of more than three
- 6 people every day; suicides accounted for 61% of gun deaths, and homicides were 38%, and
- WHEREAS, in Michigan, an average of 89 children and teens die from gun violence every year, and 52% of these
- deaths are homicides.; in Flint in 2021, 21.71 violent crimes were committed per 1,000 people, 0.825 homicides per
- 9 1,000 people, and 2.9 non-fatal shootings per 1,000 people, and
- WHEREAS, family physicians are working to improve knowledge and awareness among the patient population about
- gun safety and we aim to provide education and counseling intervention about gun safety in our communities, now,
- therefore, be it
- 13 **RESOLVED**, that Michigan Academy of Family Physicians work with the Michigan Department of Health and Human
- 14 Services to share resources and provide free gun safety kits, which include gun locks and instructions on use as well
- as gun safety guides, which include information on safe handling, safe storage in both home and vehicle, child and
- adolescent safety, and information for family physicians on how to recognize individuals at high risk for violence.
